Regroup the Rogue Valley Broadband Action Team (RVBAT) after the previous coordinator's departure and discuss next steps.

Key Takeaways

- The group represents diverse interests (education, libraries, service providers, local government) working towards broadband access and digital literacy in the region.
- Challenges were discussed around applying for broadband infrastructure grants due to burdensome requirements and lack of detailed census/demographic data.

- There is interest in creating a repository of digital literacy resources/classes being offered and tracking attendance.
- The Oregon Broadband Equity Coalition was highlighted as a valuable statewide group to join.

Topics

Introductions and Interests

- Education representatives want to inform broadband decisions impacting students and look at equity/access issues.
- Libraries aim to provide barrier-free digital literacy classes, especially for seniors.
- Service providers shared challenges around applying for infrastructure grants.
- Local government representatives came to learn and explore partnership opportunities.

Grant Challenges

- Stringent requirements and lack of detailed census data made some grants too burdensome to apply for, even for larger companies.
- Suggestion to provide feedback to state broadband office on improving grant processes.

Digital Literacy Repository

- Interest in creating a central repository of digital literacy class offerings, audiences, and attendance to demonstrate impact.
- Libraries, education providers, and service providers could contribute.

Oregon Broadband Equity Coalition

- Statewide multi-sector coalition focused on digital equity, with monthly meetings.
- Seen as a valuable group to join for collaboration.

Next Steps

- Proceed with planning the July RVBAT meeting.
- Follow up on creating the digital literacy repository, involving key contributors.
- Share information on the Oregon Broadband Equity Coalition for members to join.

Action Items

- Provide feedback on grant application process barriers
- Collect information on digital literacy resources, classes offered, audiences, and attendance; share information within group; and offer classes based on community needs
